

Guatemala Base Station Site Conflict



Overview

This work examines the security challenges confronting Guatemala, and the efforts of the current administration of Bernardo Arevalo to confront them. The Guatemalan internal armed conflict begins when a failed revolt by left-wing military officers led the military government to launch a counter-insurgency campaign in response. It keeps decision-makers up-to-date with developments in over 70 conflicts and crises every month, identifying trends and alerting them to risks of escalation and opportunities to advance. The U. Guatemala is bordered by the North Pacific Ocean and the Gulf of Honduras (also known as the Caribbean Sea). In the process, it has reawakened old memories of the darkest days of the internal armed conflict. Renewable energy transition projects in Latin America have triggered several conflicts with marginalised populations, particularly indigenous communities, amplifying unjust externalities and deepening existing inequalities. after 36 years.

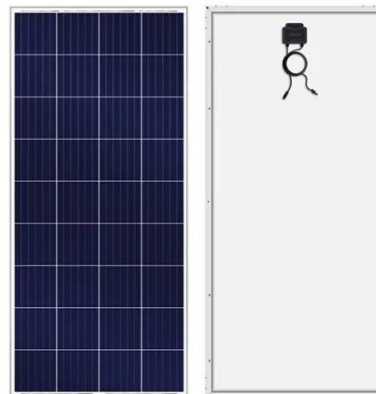
